In fact, Olivia's graduation will take place on October 22. This is not because of COVID. This is because - I am not totally sure. No one here seems to know why English high schools hold graduations in October. One of Olivia's classmates likened it to more of a "homecoming" event. It's the closest answer to a "reason" that we have.

A missionary challenge is always to balance your home culture with your field culture. Contented missionaries embrace the best of both. We had special senior pictures taken and mailed graduation announcements. We will also joyfully attend the ceremony being held two months after she has started college. We are grateful to be serving where a good education is possible. Praise the Lord who does all things well.

Note from Charles: Olivia will be attending Marianopolis College near downtown Montreal starting in August. She will be studying Commerce, and Lord willing will graduate with a DEC - Diplôme d'études collégiales — or the equivalent of the 1st year of university in the US or English Canada.

### **Work Down South**

This month I spoke with an LCMS family in the Virgin Islands who have been attending our worship services virtually since last spring. Their grandchildren have been faithful participants in our kids club as well. We are beginning earnest discussions about a mission to these island territories of the US just a half hour flight from Puerto Rico. They had read parts of the Gospel in India, and begun attending worship services. In 2019 they moved to Canada, just weeks before most of the country locked down due to COVID. Seeing our new sign (!) and realizing our church was open and having services, they decided to attend.

I will be meeting with the whole family and some of their friends this week. We hope to baptize the parents and children at an upcoming service, and prepare the adults for the Lord's Supper.
